STOP

Stop Work If It's Not Safe

You have the power and responsibility to stop work if you see something unsafe. Speak up right away without fear of getting in trouble.

Stop work if you:

- Observe an emergency situation
- Notice unsafe conditions or risky behavior that could cause harm
- See work being done differently and less safely than planned
- Witness a serious or near-miss incident
- Notice a safety rule being broken

Your safety and your coworkers' safety come first. When in doubt, stop and report it immediately.

TALK

Speak Up About Safety

You have the authority and responsibility to talk about safety with anyone. If you see a hazard or have a concern, speak up. It's important to work together to stay safe.

To start a safety conversation:

- Be respectful and treat others the way you would want to be treated.
- Ask questions with curiosity and courage.
- Introduce yourself if you don't know the person.
- Clearly explain your concern and give specific details.

Safety is everyone's job. Your voice can help prevent accidents.

RESET

Act On Safety Feedback

When someone shares a safety concern or correction, listen and respond with respect. Their goal is to keep you and others from injury.

How to handle safety feedback:

- Stay open to corrections.
- Show respect to the person giving feedback.
- Listen carefully and make sure you understand.
- Stay positive, even if you disagree or feel uncomfortable.

Your safety is in the hands of everyone you work with. By supporting each other you can remain injury-free.
